### Summary of Spending PPG

The pupil premium is an allocation of funding provided to schools to support children who may be vulnerable to underachievement. The amount received is dependent on the number of children who are eligible and have claimed for free school meals at any time in the last six years. All schools are required to report on the amount of funding they receive and how this is being used.

### Principles

- We organise teaching and learning at Stoke Gabriel in order to meet the needs of all children in the best way.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for children who belong to vulnerable groups and that socially disadvantaged children have their needs adequately assessed and met.
- We will allocate Pupil Premium funding after a needs analysis to identify priority groups and individuals.

After careful consideration of evidence and our own school priorities, during 2013-2014 we spent the money on:

1. Additional classroom support available for children working below age related expectations.
2. Continued delivery of THRIVE support for vulnerable pupils on a daily basis – as required.
3. Provision of TAs to implement intervention 1:1 or small groups
4. Some of our children with additional needs have had access to specialist resources to support their learning.
5. Additional enrichment programmes, including Forest Schools, school clubs, school trips and residential trips.

The Governors, Executive Headteacher and Head of School monitor the impact of this provision using a number of different measures including pupil progress and attainment data, lesson observations and consultation with pupils and parents.

5. Provision of intervention groups for English and Maths for pupils who are working below age related expectations.
6. Some of our children with additional needs have had access to specialist resources to support their learning.
7. Additional enrichment programmes, including Forest Schools, school clubs, school trips and residential trips.
